BIENVENIDOS



History and Purpose



Rafael Agustín

Born in Ecuador, Agustín moved to the United States at the age of 7, where he began his educational journey in public schools and community colleges. He eventually transferred to the University of California, Los Angeles, where he earned both a BA and MA from UCLA's School of Theater, Film & Television. Agustín is best known for his work as a writer on the acclaimed series, "Jane The Virgin," and as the author of the bestselling comedic memoir, "Illegally Yours." He also has the distinct honor of being a past Sundance Institute Episodic Fellow.

He served as the founding Executive Director of the Youth Cinema Project and as the founding CEO of the Latino Film Institute. In 2018, the United Nations invited Rafael to speak at their 70th Anniversary Celebration of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. In 2022, the LA Times declared Rafael a "Power Player" in their inaugural LA Vanguardia class. Rafael is a Board Member of Mother Jones, the oldest nonprofit investigative newsroom in the United States, and of the National Film Preservation Board at the Library of Congress.

RAFAEL AGUSTÍN ORADOR PRINCIPAL DE HEC

Nacido en Ecuador, Agustín se mudó a los Estados Unidos a la edad de 7 años, donde inició su trayectoria educativa en escuelas públicas y colegios comunitarios. Finalmente se transfirió a la Universidad de California en Los Angeles, donde obtuvo una licenciatura y una maestría en la Escuela de Teatro, Cine y Televisión de la UCLA. Agustín es mejor conocido por su trabajo como escritor en la aclamada serie "Jane the Virgin"; así como autor de las memorias cómicas más vendidas,"Illegally Yours". También tiene el honor distintivo de haber sido Miembro Episódico del Sundance Institute. Se desempeñó como Director Ejecutivo Fundador del Youth Cinema Project y como Director Ejecutivo Fundador del Latino Film Institute. En el 2018, las Naciones Unidas invitaron a Rafael a hablar en la ceremonia del 70 Aniversario de la Declaración Universal de los Derechos Humanos. En el 2022, el LA TIMES declaró a Rafael como un "Power Player" en su clase inaugural de LA Vanguardia.

Rafael es miembro de la junta directiva de Mother Jones, la sala de investigación sin fines de lucro más antigua en los Estados Unidos, y de la Junta Nacional de la Preservación Cinematográfica de la Biblioteca del Congreso.

FOUNDER OF THE MJC HISPANIC EDUCATION CONFERENCE

Señor Juan Alvarez grew up in Bizbee, Arizona, where he attended K through 12th grade. While in high school he was a triathlete, participating in football, track and basketball. On the basketball court he was known as the "biggest little man on the court."

After high school, Mr. Alvarez attended Northern Arizona University but was forced to leave school and take a job to help support his family. He took a job in the minefields and worked tirelessly for two years until the miners went on strike. He took that as an opportunity to return to school. He completed his Bachelor's of Arts in Industrial Arts and went on to complete his master's degree in counseling from Northern Arizona University.

"The Juan and Only", as he was endearingly known on our campus, began his MJC career in 1975 and retired from Modesto Junior College in 2004. It was at MJC that he saw a need to help empower, motivate, and encourage Hispanic students to attend college. At the time, the Hispanic population at MJC was approximately 6% and the drop-out rate was too high to accept. It was 40 years ago, in 1984, that Mr. Alvarez and a group of his colleagues founded the MJC Hispanic Education Conference. Today the Hispanic population at MJC has grown to approximately 55% of MJC's population of 20,000.

As we celebrate the 40th Annual MJC Hispanic Education Conference, we would like to honor Mr. Juan Alvarez for his commitment to you, our future, and we welcome him to Modesto Junior College once again.

El Señor Juan Alvarez creció en Bizbee, Arizona, donde asistió a la escuela desde el Jardín de Niños hasta el Grado 12. Después de la preparatoria, el Sr. Álvarez asistió a Northern Arizona University pero se vio obligado a abandonar sus estudios universitarios y conseguir un empleo para mantener a su familia. Aceptó un empleo en los campos de minas y trabajó ahí incansablemente por dos años hasta que los mineros se fueron a la huelga. Él tomó esto como una oportunidad para regresar a la escuela. Completó sus estudios en la Licenciatura en Artes Industriales y terminó su maestría en Consejería en Northern Arizona University.

"El Juan y Único", como cariñosamente se le conocía en nuestro campus, inició su carrera en MJC en 1975 y se retiró de Modesto Junior College en 2004. Fue en MJC donde vio la necesidad ayudar a empoderar, motivar y alentar a estudiantes hispanos a asistir a la universidad . En ese momento la población hispana en MJC era aproximadamente 6% y la taza de deserción era muy alto para aceptarla. Fue hace 40 años, en 1984, cuando el Sr. Álvarez y un grupo de colegas fundaron la Conferencia Hispana de Educación de MJC. Hoy en día, la población hispana en MJC ha crecido un 55% aproximadamente de un total de 20,000 estudiantes.


