Whereas, The California Community College “Vision for Success” states, “Our vision is to the point: making sure students from all backgrounds succeed in reaching their goals and improving their families and communities”, and

Whereas, The YCCD mission statement states, “the Yosemite Community College District is committed to responding to the needs of our diverse community through excellence in teaching, learning and support programs contributing to social, cultural, and economic development and wellness”, and

Whereas, MJC’s mission statement states, “we provide a dynamic, innovative, undergraduate educational environment for the ever-changing populations and workforce needs of our regional community”, and
