Resolution: FL04-E
Making Micrograde Available to Faculty**

- Proposed by:** Executive Committee
- Whereas:** “Grading policies” are one of the “academic and professional matters” that the Academic Senate is to make recommendations on; and
- Whereas:** Faculty usually calculate and express grades by classroom management programs; and
- Whereas:** MJC provides only one classroom management program, which is Gradequick; and
- Whereas:** Neither the faculty nor the Academic Senate were formally consulted in the selection process; and
- Whereas:** Micrograde is preferable than Gradequick to a significant number of faculty; and
- Whereas:** Micrograde is more consistent with college level requirements; and
- Whereas:** Micrograde is more intuitive; and
- Whereas:** Micrograde offers better and easier manipulation of data; and
- Whereas:** Micrograde can download rosters and grades directly from WebCT, making it more compatible with Datatel,
- Therefore:** **Be it resolved,** that the MJC Senate recommends that the Dean of Instructional Services make Micrograde and/or other grade management programs available to faculty who prefer those programs over Gradequick.
