RESOLUTION FL99-C: Survey of the Faculty Regarding the Academic Senate Curriculum Committee and Possible Changes to the Curriculum Committee Charge and Membership
MAY 6, 1999

- Proposed by:** Dan Keller upon the request of several members of the faculty.
- Whereas,** many faculty members have had complaints about the process by which courses are evaluated by the Curriculum Committee, and
- Whereas,** some faculty members have had complaints about the performance of some members of the Curriculum Committee, specifically, their own division representatives, and
- Whereas,** some faculty members have been reluctant to share their complaints and/or comments directly with the Curriculum Committee, and
- Whereas,** the Curriculum Committee is interested in faculty input regarding methods of improving their policies, and
- Whereas,** the Curriculum Committee is part of the Academic Senate;
- Therefore,** **be it resolved** that the Academic Senate survey the faculty with the following questions:
1. Are you satisfied with the way courses are evaluated by the Curriculum Committee?
 2. Are you satisfied with the performance of your division's representative(s) on the Curriculum Committee?
- And
- Therefore,** **be it further resolved** that, if the majority of responses to question No. 1 are affirmative, the Academic Senate will investigate methods by which the course evaluation process can be improved, and amend its charge to the Curriculum Committee to include these methods, and
- Therefore,** **be it further resolved** that, if the majority of responses to question No. 2 are affirmative, the Academic Senate charges the Curriculum Committee to impose term limits of two years on its members (other than the Vice President of Instruction).
