RESOLUTION SP95-A: ACADEMIC ADMINISTRATOR AS A SENATE MEMBER
FEBRUARY 9, 1995

PROPOSED BY: ACADEMIC SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

WHEREAS: The authors of the Institutional Self-Study Report of Modesto Junior College recommended: "...that the offer of reciprocal courtesies of representation on key management and faculty committees be considered, by both groups, as a means toward enhancing understanding and aiding in productive discussion of issues of joint concern."

WHEREAS: The strengthening of the Senate role in the Academic and professional matters by A.B. 1725 requires that the Senate have access to all opinion and information from the Academic Deans Council, and

WHEREAS: The Academic Deans Council is largely composed of former academic instructors, former academic senate presidents, and other academic leaders, and

WHEREAS: The need to come to consensus concerning such items as policy, process, and procedures with the academic administration is greater than ever,

THEREFORE: BE IT RESOLVED that the following amendment to the MJC Academic Senate By-Laws (ratified January 28, 1993) be adopted:

1. By-Law Change

Article III. Membership and Representation

Section I: Membership

A. Same

B. Any member of the Academic Deans Council of MJC so designated may become a member of the MJC Academic Senate with no voting powers and may not hold office.

(Refer to Article III, Section 2.)

C. Same as "B" in By-Laws of 1993

Section 2: Representation

A. Same

B. Same

C. One academic administrator shall be selected by the MJC Academic Deans Council to represent the Academic Administrators of MJC. The election process and term will be determined by the Deans Council in writing and filed with the Academic Senate.

D. Same as "C" in By-Laws of 1993

ACTION: February 9, 1995
