RESOLUTION FL92-G: COLLEGE COUNCIL TO  
STUDY PRE-COLLEGIATE/BASIC SKILLS DISCIPLINES

PROPOSED BY: ALLEN BOYER

WHEREAS: the Seymour-Campbell Matriculation Act of 1986 (Assembly Bill 3) has brought into question the use of prerequisite, and

WHEREAS: M.J.C. has at present no entry floor requirement for students, and

WHEREAS: M.J.C. has made no study to determine the relationship, if any, between course requirements and failing or withdrawing students, and

WHEREAS: there is little or no interdisciplinary communication networks available for faculty to use, and

WHEREAS: the distinction between and rationale for credit and non-credit courses is unclear to faculty, and

WHEREAS: the Board of Governors' policy establishes a 30 semester unit limit on non-degree applicable basic skills courses and whereas it is unclear who at M.J.C. monitors this limitation and subsequent action, and

WHEREAS: in the report to the Board of Governors May 1990, the Basic Skills Task Force makes 5 recommendations to meet the requirement of A.B. 1725 and A.B. 3, M.J.C. faculty need to know the progress of these recommendations on campus.

THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED the Academic Senate requests the College Council undertake a study of the pre-collegiate/basic skills disciplines presently offered at M.J.C. with the results and recommendation to be brought before the Academic Senate by the end of spring semester 1993.
