RESOLUTION FL95-H: RULE 9001
NOVEMBER 9, 1995

Proposed by: Academic Senate Executive Committee

WHEREAS, with Governor Wilson's signing of SB437-Lewis, rule 9001 has been rescinded and,

WHEREAS, we no longer are required to survey or meet the mandates of Rule 9001, employers are being encouraged to voluntarily continue to implement changes in transportation behavior and,

WHEREAS, the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District is still mandated to meet a 1.50 average vehicle ridership by 1999 and may randomly survey employees to obtain their data and, additionally, there is always the possibility that, in the future, there would be a federal mandate to reduce and/or modify transportation usage and,

WHEREAS, the air quality in Stanislaus County is among the worst in the nation and,

WHEREAS, the Yosemite Community College District Rule 9001 Committee has decided to complete the November commute survey,

THEREFORE, the Academic Senate of Modesto Junior College supports the survey, encourages full cooperation of all faculty and staff in completing and returning the survey and encourages the Rule 9001 Committee to continue its important advocacy of a more environmentally appropriate college and district transportation pattern.

ACTION: It was moved on November 16, 1995, to postpone action until Senate receives a report re total cost of personnel, etc. to carry on the program.

FINAL ACTION: November 30, 1995

DISPOSITION: Carried
