The Senate Petitions Sub-Committee offers the following recommendations for the structure and constituency of the Petitions Committee, a presidential college committee:

1. Composition of the committee:
  - A. Administrators
    1. Co-chair appointed by the president of the college.
    2. One (1) instructional Dean appointed by the Instructional Administrators Council
  - B. Faculty
    1. One (1) Counselor appointed by the faculty counselors
    2. Four (4) at-large Faculty appointed by the MJC Academic Senate.
    3. The faculty and student members of the committee will elect one of their members as co-chair.
2. The committee will select its own procedures, including which petitions will be considered by the committee or co-chairs alone.

PROPOSED BY: SENATE PETITIONS SUB-COMMITTEE

RESOLVED: Petitions Committee should be structured as follows:

1. Composition of the committee:
  - A. Administrators
    1. Co-chair appointed by the president of the college.
    2. One (1) instructional Dean appointed by the Instructional Administrators Council
  - B. Faculty
    1. One (1) Counselor appointed by the faculty counselors
    2. Three (3) at-large Faculty appointed by the MJC Faculty Senate.
    3. The faculty members of the committee will elect one of their members as co-chair.
  - C. Student
    1. One (1) student representative appointed by the Associated Students of Modesto Junior College.
2. The committee will select its own procedures, including which petitions will be considered by the committee or co-chairs alone.
