I. APPROVAL OF ORDER OF AGENDA

Hearing no objections, the order of the agenda was approved as stated with a request from T. Guy to accommodate guests.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

November 13, 2018 & December 6, 2018

T. Akers-Porter noted that information that she had stated was missing under the MATH 172 and MATH 173 discussion at the November 13, 2018 meeting. T. Akers-Porter mentioned that in the November 13, 2018 minutes her focus appeared to be on success data, which was actually covered in B. Adams's PowerPoint. T. Akers-Porter noted that the focus of her remarks was on content being too much for the number of hours. T. Akers-Porter shared that 92 other Community Colleges have five units Calculus courses and mentioned that a number of Universities also have five-unit Calculus courses. T. Akers-Porter continued that our Tutoring Center didn't have the resources that many other Community College and University Tutoring Centers have. T. Akers-Porter pointed out that Bakersfield Community College, who is approximately the same size and with the same demographic, has a million dollar budget and that our budget is at one to two hundred thousand, depending whom you talk to, which speaks to adequate resources. T. Akers-Porter commented that MATH 173 instructor A. Adams' remarks were not reflected in the minutes as he spoke to the difficulty of getting through the amount of course content on the C-ID. T. Akers-Porter reiterated that her argument was focused on content and the amount of content that was to be covered in four hours. T. Akers-Porter requested that this information be reflected in the November 13, 2018 minutes. T. Akers-Porter noted that she could summarize her concerns into a bulleted list and provide them to the Instruction Office to be incorporated into the November 13, 2018 Curriculum Committee minutes.

Extensive discussion ensued regarding the November 13, 2018 Curriculum Committee minutes and Robert's Rules of Order with the following comments stated for documentation purposes.

T. Guy requested that the section of Robert's Rules of Order regarding a tie vote be reflected in the November 13, 2018 meeting's minutes. B. Adams indicated that since Robert's Rules of Order was not mentioned at the November meeting that it couldn't be added to the November 13, 2018 minutes, but would be reflected here in the January 22, 2019 meeting minutes. B. Adams noted that Robert's Rules state: "On a tie vote, a motion requiring a majority vote for adoption is lost, since a tie is not a majority." (Robert's Rules of Order: Newly Revised, Tenth Edition, p.392). T. Guy noted that as a committee we follow Robert's Rules of Order, so procedurally these votes failed.

In accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act and SB 751, minutes of the MJC Curriculum committee record the votes of all committee members as follows. (1) Members recorded as absent are presumed not to have voted; (2) the names of members voting in the minority or abstaining are recorded; (3) all other members are presumed to have voted in the majority.

L. Manzo commented that she was under the impression and that it was declared specifically that M. Morales was at the November 13, 2018 Curriculum Committee meeting for the purpose of observing that Parliamentary Procedures were followed. L. Manzo noted that she was having a hard time understanding why Senate was involved and that things may change. L. Manzo also remarked that this (SPAN 109 and SPAN 110) would have gone through "as is", but now it turns out that breaking the tie was illegal, so therefore we could continue down that road, but now there is resistance to that. L. Manzo specifically requested that her comments be reflected in the minutes.

B. Adams replied, that as a point-of-information, that in terms of her voting, she had not seen any terminology that says her vote was illegal. B. Adams stated that she was out-of-order and requested that her response also be reflected in the minutes.

T. Akers-Porter wanted the record to show that a few division representatives went to C. Martin and C. Redwing to ask about that vote (the tie breaking vote on SPAN 109, SPAN 110, MATH 172, and MATH 173) and were told that the vote didn't happen correctly and that B. Adams was notified of being out-of-order. T. Akers-Porter continue to mention that when B. Adams didn't bring the issue up at the next meeting and that the Academic Senate had a resolution on the Senate table it was assumed the committee was waiting on the Academic Senate to pass policy. T. Akers-Porter remarked that it was unfair to say, "you didn't call me out-of-order" at the meeting when they believed they were following proper procedure.

J. Zellet voiced her appreciation of the real concern for adhering to Robert's Rules of Order. J. Zellet mentioned that as we study and look at Robert's Rules of Order and because we are a Brown Act committee, she encourages everyone to pay attention to the rules about what happens before a committee meeting. J. Zellet noted that conferring with people before a meeting via email can be considered a serial vote which is illegal along with going from person, to person, to person tallying votes before a meeting. The point of being a Brown Act committee is conducting business in public and being transparent. J. Zellet encouraged everyone to pay attention to the integrity of how we do all our business and that if this is the set of rules we are going to follow, we should follow all of them.

L. Manzo requested clarification, that if there are things that were said at the November 13, 2018 Curriculum Committee meeting that she would like included in the minutes regarding the Brown Act and the violation of the Brown Act, can she send that information to K. Addington to include in the November 13, 2018 meeting minutes as a correction to the minutes.

L. Manzo commented, that for transparency purposes, during a discussion at that meeting, B. Adams made a statement saying that she violated the Brown Act in the spring, regarding language courses 101 and 102 by adding extra comments after the vote in CurricUNET. L. Manzo noted she would like that documented.

B. Adams noted that at the February 6, 2018 meeting she made the point-of-information that those comments were removed from CurricUNET by Governet.

M/S/C (R. CRIPE, T. GUY) to table the discussion of the November 13, 2018 Curriculum Committee meeting minutes until after the Academic Senate makes a decision on policy enabling the committee to move forward in a more informed and guided manner.

ADJU 235 pulled for discussion by T. Guy.

T. Akers-Porter, referring to T. Guy's comments at Technical Review and Articulation Officer, L. Senechal's report, noted the only articulation for ADJU 235 was with CSU Los Angeles and that course had a prerequisite and ours didn't. T. Akers-Porter questioned if this course transfers, pointing out that ADJU 235 only had two sections offered in the fall with ADJU 236 being offered in the spring, which ADJU 235 is a prerequisite. T. Akers-Porter also questioned if students and faculty know if there might be a better option for the ADT, something that transfers more readily.

G. Hausmann confirmed that ADJU 235 does transfer and C-ID AJ 200 is approved. G. Hausmann clarified that ADJU 235 – Introduction to Corrections is a separate course in the program; that corrections is one area of the field and law enforcement is another. G. Hausmann mentioned that although Introduction to Corrections and Correctional Law are inter-related, they are separate. G. Hausmann noted that the State of California has two separate certifying bodies; one for law enforcement and one for the field of corrections, but both are under Administration of Justice. G. Hausmann explained that ADJU 235 has never had an advisory or prerequisite and to his knowledge, both Administration of Justice students and faculty are aware of options associated with their field of study.

L. Senechal commented on issues that may be associated with the C-ID website and recommended if faculty had questions regarding a specific C-ID not to hesitate to contact her.

J. Zellet pointed out that the conversation was unique in that it involved both Career Technical Education as well as transfer.

ADJU 235 pulled for discussion by T. Guy who asked why the comparable course at CSU Los Angeles had a prerequisite and our ADJU 235 did not.

G. Hausmann referred to ADJU 201 as an overview of Administration of Justice which included, in a limited capacity, information on the field of corrections, whereas ADJU 235 is from "Day One" of when punishment is executed to where the system wants to go, taking the information covered in ADJU 201 to a broader scope (see above comments for additional information).
