A review of your MJC grades at the end of the summer 2015 semester indicates that you are not in Good Standing.

Students are considered “not in Good Standing” when the cumulative Modesto Junior College (MJC) GPA is below 2.0 and/or when 50% or more of the overall units attempted at MJC have the following grades: W, I, NC, and NP. Consecutive semesters in which you are not in Good Standing can eventually lead to **DISMISSAL** from the college. Please do not delay in seeking support!

Important Notice: Standings will also affect Priority Registration. Per Title 5 §58108 students on academic and/or progress probation for two or more consecutive terms will lose priority registration. This means that if you enroll in fall 2015 classes and earn a second semester probation at the end of this current semester, you will register last for your summer 2016 and fall 2016 classes.

You are encouraged to seek assistance from your instructors and to utilize the following services:

- Visit your instructors during their office hours. Details should be listed on your course syllabi.
- Sign up for Study Skills 25 or 78 courses.

- Visit with a counselor to discuss strategies for success and future educational planning.

You will return to Good Standing when your cumulative MJC record shows the following: 1) a 2.0 or higher GPA and/or 2) less than 50% of the overall units attempted have the following grades: W, I, NC, and NP. With your current Fall 2015 classes, you may be able to improve your standing but you must avoid earning poor grades and W, I, NC, and NP grades.

Students are considered in “Good Standing” when the cumulative Modesto Junior College (MJC) GPA is 2.0 or better and when less than 50% of the overall units attempted have the following grades: W, I, NC, and NP.

When students are not in good standing, they are placed on Probation. Three consecutive semesters not in good standing will lead to Dismissal from MJC.

There are **two** types of Probation and Dismissal:

- “Academic” which is based on your cumulative (overall) MJC GPA.
- ”Progress” which is based on the overall percentage of Withdrawal, Incomplete, and No Credit/No Pass marks on your record.

“**Academic Probation**” occurs when the student has enrolled in a minimum of 12 units at MJC and his or her cumulative grade point average falls below 2.0. If a student's cumulative GPA remains below 2.0 for three consecutive semesters, the student’s standing will be “Academic Dismissal.” The student will be dismissed from MJC for one calendar year.

MA1 = Academic Probation, first semester
MA2 = Academic Probation, second semester
MAD = Academic Dismissal

“**Progress Probation**” occurs when the student has enrolled in a minimum of 12 units at MJC and the percentage of W, I, NC, and NP’s reaches or exceeds 50% of the total attempted units. If this percentage remains at 50% or above for three consecutive semesters, the student’s standing will be “Progress Dismissal.” The student will be dismissed from MJC for one calendar year.

MP1 = Progress Probation, first semester
MP2 = Progress Probation, second semester
MPD = Progress Dismissal

Please note: It is possible for a student’s standing to include both Academic and Progress Probation and/or Dismissal at the same time.
