X. ASMJC Shared Governance Council/Committees:

A. YCCD Board Meetings-Harloveleen Hundal & Ninebra Mansour

Student Trustee stated they met in Columbia two weeks ago. They started with the close session, discussed policy of first reading revise and got updates. She mentions, Chancellor stated that a MJC College Committee is creating a parking issue, and want students input. She also states that the Board of Trustee will be discussing the YCCD Policy 7232 Classification Review, 78037 Duty of Employees, and the 78053 Position Classification and will present it to the Board Meeting next month for 2nd Reading.
